Discussion and/or Possible Action on The recommendation from the Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition (LANCC) that Rampart Village Neighborhood Council should take a position on the motion that finds the actions of Mayor Garcetti to be unacceptable in regards to his response to the Typhus epidemic which has continued to worsen, with 107 people now infected; the Mayor has allowed heaps of uncollected garbage to linger on the streets of Los Angeles & failed to fulfill a promise to fumigate for fleas & vermin on the twenty-three blocks in Downtown Los Angeles known as the Typhus Zone creating breeding grounds for the disease; as of November 1, 2018, the Department of Public Works has only fumigated six out of twenty-three blocks endangering public health; moving forward, the Rampart Village Neighborhood Council demands that the Mayor & the Department of Public Works finish eradicating the cause of the Typhus outbreak in the Typhus Zone within the next seven days & create an outreach plan through the City's current homeless outreach channels to educate the public on how to mitigate the spread of Typhus
