

## Parks, Planning, Public Works, and Land Use (PPPWLU) Committee Thursday, August 14, 2025 at 6:00pm MINUTES

### 1. Call to Order

 A duly noticed meeting of Rampart Village Neighborhood Council (RVNC) PPWLU Committee Meeting was held on Thursday, August 14, 2025, on the Zoom platform (Meeting ID No. 892 7294 9372). Chair Alberto Veloso called the meeting to order at 6:02 PM.

## 2. Roll Call and Approval of Outstanding Minutes

- Alberto Veloso, Tabasa Ozawa, Hector Quezadal, and Robert Reyes Villagómez were present.
  Quorum is three and was met at the start of the meeting.
- The meeting was recorded for the purposes of documentation.
- The committee voted to approve the minutes from the June 12, 2025 meeting.

  - Seconded by: Robert Reyes Villagómez
  - Vote: 4-0-0 (Motion Passed)

## 3. Public Comment on Non-Agenda Items

• There were four members of the public present: Philip Armstrong, Cathy J. Hood, Fahad Siadat, and Cynthia Siadat. There was no public comment on non-agenda items.

# 4. Committee & Community Introductions

- Committee members (Alberto, Hector, Robert, Tabasa) introduced themselves, sharing personal and professional backgrounds.
- Community members introduced:
  - Cathy J. Hood LA County Commissioner; PR and outreach professional; newly moved into Rampart Village; active in community cleanups in Hollywood.
  - Fahad Siadat & Cynthia Benton Street residents; musician and interfaith minister/psychotherapist; interested in organizing local cleanups.

Philip Armstrong – Chair of the RVNC Public Safety, Housing, and Transportation Committee; RVNC President; resident of LA Eco-Village.

## 5. Main Agenda Item – Clean California Community Designation

- Discussion focused on steps toward achieving the Clean California Community Designation, requiring completion of 10 out of 15 criteria.
- Progress so far:
  - Pledge signed.
  - Advisory board created (the PPPWLU Committee serves this role).
  - Community input process initiated via meetings and outreach.

### **Key Discussion Points:**

### • Community Input & Outreach

- Hector suggested using RVNC Instagram and broader social media; noted another board member may take over managing accounts.
- Robert suggested flyers, surveys, and park postings to gather feedback on hotspots and recruit volunteers.
- Cathy emphasized door-knocking, flyers (possible sponsorship by Staples), partnerships with local businesses, and face-to-face engagement as more effective than social media alone.
- Fahad & Cynthia shared that their Benton Street block faces persistent illegal dumping;
  they've already connected with neighbors who are interested in forming a cleanup group.

#### Litter Assessments

- Alberto shared existing trash maps and noted a decrease in public trash cans.
- Identified hotspots: Benton Street (behind Lafayette apartments), alley between Lafayette & Occidental, and areas near encampments close to LA Eco-Village.

#### Cleanups

- Committee expressed interest in organizing regular monthly cleanups, inspired by groups like Silver Lake's "Trash Humans."
- Discussion of leveraging 311 reporting and council district field deputies (notably Diana Vicente, CD1) to expedite bulky item pickups.

Philip shared his committee's experience partnering with Caltrans for Clean California
 Community Days of Action, providing tools, bags, and logistical support.

# 6. Summary of Action Items

- Alberto Veloso:
  - Research out to **government offices** for resources and promotion.
- Tabasa Ozawa:
  - o Create a **dedicated social media account** for campaign branding and cleanup efforts.
- Robert Reyes Villagómez:
  - o Develop **flyer/survey strategy** for outreach and volunteer recruitment.
