IN CONFORMITY WITH THE JANUARY 1, 2026 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 707 (DURAZO) AND LA CITY COUNCIL FILE 23-1114, THE RAMPART VILLAGE NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED VIRTUALLY.

Every person wishing to address the Committee must dial 669.900.6833, and enter 851 6123 2288 and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Committee on any agenda item before the Committee takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Committee's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Committee meeting. Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Committee.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).**

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).**

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5).**

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A).**

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).**

 - 1. Discussion and possible action to follow-up on the Central LA virtual community workshop to develop a community-driven action plan to improve walking and biking safety focusing on neighborhood schools of Commonwealth Avenue ES, Frank Del Olmo, and Lafayette Park PC. The SRTS Center City Schools Neighborhood Safety & Climate Resilience Project webpage: <https://ladotlivablestreets.org/projects/center-city-SRTS>. On March 5, 2026, LADOT provided the [ATP6 Fact Sheet](#). In a July 10, 2026 update for ATP6 Center City Schools, CD 13 told us LADOT is currently in the design phase and is obtaining a design consultant. They plan to hold in-person public outreach/input during the early design phase, which CD 13 will help coordinate with the residents. They plan to complete the design by March 2028 and begin construction by January 2029. We referenced this update in our July 21, 2026 [community impact statement](#) for Council File [26-0600-S11](#). Mark Fuentes told us at our September 3 meeting that he would talk to Emma Howard and Ted Walker and get back to us on the status of the SRTS project.

 - B. **New Business**
 - 4. Discussion and possible action to document conditions of nearby encampments with locations and dates and coordinate with Everest Value School and Central City Value High School so their staff know to flag changes to CD 13. On August 11, 2026, President David Doyle of the Value Schools Foundation wrote to Councilmember Hugo Soto-Martinez requesting assistance from CD 13 regarding the encampments on the northside of Beverly Blvd which is 30 yards from Everest Value School and 50 yards from Central City Value High School. We understand that members of the CD 13 team plan to attend this PSHT Committee meeting between 3:30 and 4 PM to hear from the schools and the community directly.
 - 5. Discussion and possible action regarding the [Walk to School Challenge](#) 10/7 during Week without Driving. At our September 3 PSHT Committee meeting, Gloria said she will discuss it with President David Doyle of the Value Schools Foundation and get back to us. CD 13 told us that the school(s) and the CD 13 team can figure out the detail of the activation together. An example is crosswalk activation using signs and props to make crossing more visible, safer (and fun!) for students, like the picture below.



6. Discussion and possible action to discuss traffic collisions on Bimini Place and recommend to the Executive Committee to agendize for the October 20, 2026 General Board meeting to consider approving updated community impact statement(s) for Council Files 13-1592-S1 and 26-0600-S11. As discussed with Mark Fuentes at the September 15 RVNC General Board meeting, on August 28th, LAPD reported a collision on Bimini Place in which the primary collision factor was unsafe speed and there were 2 victims who were pedestrians plus the driver, for a total of 3 victims. According to a news report (MyNewLA.com), the Los Angeles Fire Department responded around 3:55 p.m. to the 100 block of South Bimini Place in Koreatown to reports of a vehicle-pedestrian collision. A vehicle had crashed through a building's fence, striking pedestrians. Three people were taken to a hospital in unknown condition. As I recall, Mark said he would discuss this collision with Emma Howard and Ted Walker and get back to us.
7. Discussion and possible action to recommend to the Executive Committee to agendize for the September 15, 2026 General Board meeting to address with a community impact statement the schedule and plans for leasing up the low-income units at 200 N Vermont Avenue (49 extremely low-income units). In answer to Philip's question, Mark Fuentes said he would confirm with the property manager at the end of September that the low-income units have been leased up and give us a status report for our October 1 PSHT Committee meeting. The community impact statement was approved on September 15 and submitted.
