In addition to increasing the number of stations, the Committee noted that a stakeholder requested that the charging stations include theft deterrence to prevent theft of charging cables.

As recommended by the Public Safety, Housing & Transportation Committee, agendize for the September 20, 2022 General Board meeting discussion and possible action on finding two locations for bike corrals in CD 13, including locating a bike corral at the LA Ecovillage Institute's Community Hub at 3554 W. 1st Street, CA 90004 and having the RVNC General Board identify another location. For details of the application process, please see LADOT's webpage on bike corrals at the follow link <https://ladotlivablestreets.org/content-detail/Bicycle-Corrals/> Tam Nguyen of LADOT has informed us that they will not require community partners to apply for the program and sign maintenance agreements. LADOT will maintain the bike corrals. It was decided at the August 16 General Board meeting to postpone this item until the September 20 General Board meeting.
12. Agendize for the September 20, 2022 General Board meeting discussion and possible action and a presentation on approving a 2022-2023 Budget Proposal and/or the Administrative Packet for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. The Admin Packet allows our Board to plan its annual budget, assign its Financial Officers, and confirm any administrative/operational services, i.e., storage space, website support, for the upcoming Fiscal Year.

18. As recommended by the Vice-President, invite Los Angeles County Sheriff Alex Villanueva, to present at the September 20, 2022 General Board meeting.
19. Discussion of roles and responsibilities of Neighborhood Council Sustainability Alliance representative and selection of representative.
20. As recommended by the Public Safety, Housing, and Transportation (PSHT) Committee, agendize for discussion and possible action regarding approval of community impact statements for Council Files 22-0978 and 22-0979. Motion for 22-0978 is instructing the City Administrative Officer, with the assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst, and all necessary Departments to report to Council with recommendations to create an Office of Unarmed Response and Safety to be established under an appropriately defined department. Motion for 22-0979 is instructing the City Administrative Officer, with the assistance of relevant City departments and external consultants, as needed, to report back within 180 days with multi-year transition plan to shift responsibility for nonviolent calls related to homelessness and emergency crisis response to unarmed, civilian personnel-and, pending the results of the study being conducted pursuant to Council File 20-0875, to

implement alternative models and methods for traffic safety enforcement that do not rely on armed law enforcement to the extent deemed feasible. In addition, the PSHT Committee requested that we ask the Council to expedite the time frame for the City Administrative Officer to report back in order to mitigate accidental or inappropriate use of force over the next several months.

21. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, agendaize for discussion and possible action regarding approval of a community impact statement for Council File 22-0002-S111. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2021-2022 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for AB 558, which would improve student health while reducing greenhouse gas emissions associated with the estimated 540 million school lunches served each year by incentivizing more plant-based school meals.
22. Agendaize for discussion and possible action approval of a community impact statement for Council File 22-1019. Motion is instructing the Los Angeles Police Department Street Racing Task Force in coordination with the Department of Transportation to report back in 30 days on data related to intersection takeovers that involve intersections, street segments, or other public right of ways, and to identify locations with the highest volume of calls regarding this issue citywide.
23. Agendaize for discussion and possible action on HCID rollout of database of all low-income housing created in projects using density bonus or Transit Oriented Communities incentives. Philip asked the City Attorney's Office about the status of their efforts, when affordable units are created in land-use projects, to execute land use covenants to create easements on the title of the property. DCA Mei-Mei Cheng referred him back to LADH for the information. GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT ON NON AGENDA ITEMS

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to two minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

AB 361 Updates -

Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

Notice to Paid Representatives -

If you are compensated to monitor, attend, or speak at this meeting, City law may require you to register as a lobbyist and report your activity. See Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 48.01 et seq.
